

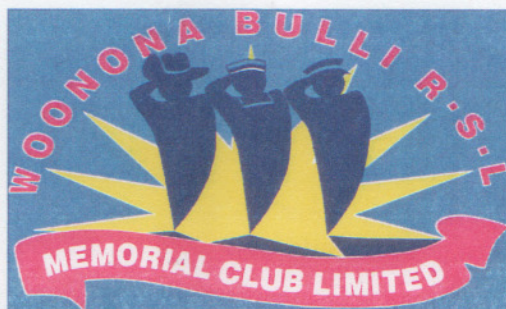

Presidents Report
