### **PRESIDENTS REPORT**

Firstly congratulations must go to first grade for another great grand final victory. The core of the team has been together for 6 or 7 years and records show that the two two-day premierships as well as the three one-day premierships makes this side the most successful 1<sup>st</sup> grade team the club has ever seen.

Eight of the guys playing in this final win also played in the previous win in 2000-01. The guys would agree that last season was not the best but their resurgence came about as a direct result of the off-season work of this seasons first grade captain Mark Johnson and club coach Matthew Pogson. A great deal was happening inside the club during the off season but the whole time the executive were exploring and securing a new major sponsor in Bulli Workers Club, (more on that soon) Mark and Poggo and I am sure others were busy securing a commitment from the first grade players to stand up and win the competition. The rest is history.

Whilst nothing is ever certain in cricket I would like to take this opportunity to mention one Butcher who indicated that this season might have been his last. Previous first grade premiership captain Andrew "Tubby" Johnson has indicated that it might be time to hang up the spikes. Andrew captained the club into the new millennium and was responsible for raising the professionalism and standard of the club on the field. He capped that transformation off by hitting a magnificent "slashing" cut-shot behind point to help deliver the club our first 1<sup>st</sup> grade premiership since 1980-82. Over the last couple of seasons Andy has become the rock of 1<sup>st</sup> grades' middle order and this year he again hit the grand final winning runs. Off the field Andy has held a number of executive and committee positions and was also responsible for successfully organising the Butchers 100 year reunion. Tubby was also solely responsible for booking a comedian for the club, one of the greats, but for the life of me I cant remember his name. Andrew, the club thanks you for you significant contribution and while we would like to see you back again next year we would also like to wish you and Kelly all the best for the future.

This season I took over the Presidency from one of the Butchers greatest clubmen. Most people might not realise but Ean Martin stepped aside after a number of years at the top and an eon in the executive and on the committee. The reason some of you might not realise is that he continues to be the hardest working Butcher in the club. Ean is not only a member of the district management committee and the Butcher gear steward but he was also the clubs go to man, unofficially holding the title of assistant president, assistant secretary, assistant treasurer, part time groundsman, and the list goes on. I can't thank Ean enough for his work over the season.

First job was securing major sponsorship for the Butchers. The obvious option for the club was the Bulli Workers Club and they failed to disappoint. That combined with the breakdown in communications resulted in training numbers dropping off. I would like to show my appreciation for all of the work Poggo put in before during and after training. Poggo has set off on a round the country trip and may or may not return in time for the start of next season.

Training numbers in my mind are the single biggest challenge facing the club and all suggestions to improve this would be greatly appreciated.

Peter Shephard also needs thanks here. Sheppy has been the chief and at times only selector for the club over the last 4 or 5 seasons. Selector can at time be not only the hardest job in the club, but also the most arduous. I doubt that there was one week when Shep didn't have to make at least 5 changes after the team were selected on Tuesday with most of these occurring on a Friday night and Saturday morning due to late notification of player unavailability. We were fortunate this year that there were so many keen juniors willing to help us out on short notice.

Other thanks go to the Executive. Treasurer Adam Goss was pleasantly distracted from his duties this year with the arrival of his and Sharon's baby daughter and Kyle Connor who has grown into the Secretary's role and is ready to take it to the next level. The Committee, Steven Bond (Worker Club Sponsorship, Ideas Man and Players Voice), Scott Beckett (Excellent work on the bowls day, trivia night and trip away), Mark Johnson (players code of conduct) and Matthew Pogson (Captains responsibilities). Thanks also to Mick Allen (Trivia Night, Trip Away, and Club Apparel)

Next Season sees the first step in the redevelopment of Hollymount Park with the construction of our new turf pitch on the AFL field. The new pitch will be ready for the 2006-07 season. Upgrades to the clubrooms including a function room are also not too far away with funding almost secured for this. Thank to Earle Canvin and the Northern Tigers AFL for all of their work there.

Lastly I would like to thank Jodie for her support throughout the season. I would like to extend these thanks to all of the player's partners and families for letting the boys out to play with the butchers.

First may I start off with congratulating first grade for winning the first grade competition this year.

They played solid all year and were convincing throughout the semi finals and final.

Well done to Harry on captaining the champion side.

The second grade season proved to be a frustrating season in terms of minimal cricket and maximum wash outs/draws which in turn probably made it very hard to reach the semi-finals. Out of 14 games played we had five draws, six games lost first innings but more notably the games we won were won outright. This season saw 2<sup>nd</sup> grade field 29 players, with first grade calling on players throughout the season and guys having work commitments it made it hard to keep it down to 15 or so.

I believe 2<sup>nd</sup> grade had more potential than was shown on the ground. With drop catches and poor batting leading to our downfall in the majority of the lost matches. When our bowling was at full strength we were the best bowling side in the competition by far. Steve Bond was far and away the best bowler in the competition taking 43 wickets from 191 overs at an average of just over 10, and 5 times this season bowled more than 19 overs straight, well done mate!!.

When Rob Sheeley was not driving trains he proved to be another shining light for the side taking 13 wickets from only 5 matches.

Graham Sismey took 19 wickets from only 6 games, this in turn meant that he played a hand full of games in first grade. Well done Graham and if you keep moving the ball the way you have lately a lot more wickets will come your way.

Had Mick Allen had taken one more wicket this season he would have won the association averages. Mick took 24 wickets from 63 overs at an average of 9.2 The second last game showed Micks stamina which saw him bowl 25 overs straight due to the captain braking down in the first over. Although not the speedster he once was, Mick showed he can still out think a lot of batsman.

A special note to Steve Heydon showed when he did bowl in second grade. How to put the "fear of Christ" into some batsmen. Steve bowled only 26 overs and took 6 wickets, Well done Stef!

The batting as mentioned previously left a lot to be desired but this year we viewed at "batting the butcher way". I learnt after about six rounds I was wasting my time telling all the guys that we should at least once try to bat out 90 overs.

Lee Turner (a future first grader) showed at the back end of the season that when he applied himself he would never be out of place in the top order, if he corrects a couple of technical points the runs will flow his way.

The fielding/catching this year wasn't real crash hot. I think we would have averaged 5 dropped catches per match, probably the less said the better. Lee Turner won our fielding award this year which was well deserved, Lee did not let much get by him at all and saved many runs. Well done Lee!

In wrapping up, I did see this season as a chance to make the semi-finals with the team we had. It was disappointing that we did not, but I believe that everyone who did play 2s this year enjoyed their cricket and had a laugh.
