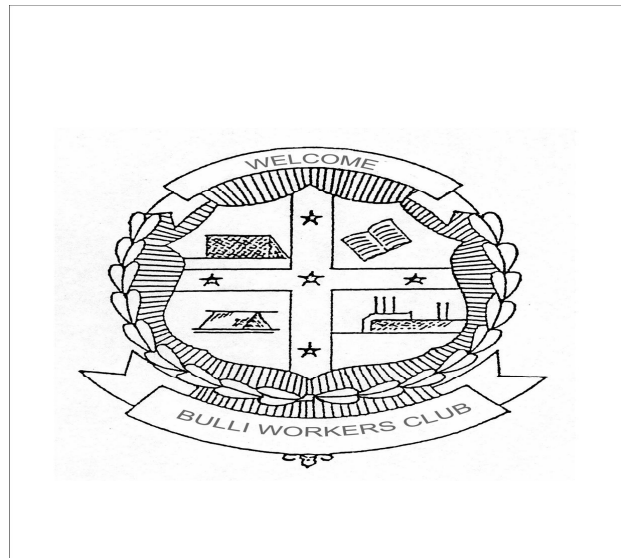

### **PRESIDENTS REPORT**

Welcome to the 2006-2007 end of season report. The Butchers had a very positive year both on and off the field and everyone involved in the club should be proud of their efforts and achievements. A big thanks firstly to the Bulli workers club who were once again outstanding supporters of the club.

I'll start with where I started last year.

As most are aware 2005-2006 was a very difficult season for the club and planning for this season started almost as soon as the last ball was bowled for the previous season. The club needed a bit of a kick start to get moving forward again and the first part of this was getting more people involved off the field.

The first step forward was an excellent one with our AGM which was very well attended and a good deal of effort was put into a presentation outlining the off field function of the club this obviously had an effect as a number of the younger guys responded very well during the season and it was very rewarding to see an influx of enthusiasm running through the club.

Ean Martin stepped aside from the secretary role and put extra effort into his various roles with the district administration. Ean still did plenty as a general committee member and gear steward and the vast bulk of what he did at direct level was very well executed and received.

Ean's big shoes were well filled by Neil Ryan who took on the secretary role. Neil had performed a tough job as a lower grade selector the year before and was looking to get more involved. He certainly got what he was after. Despite my best efforts Neil again took on a selection role to continue his good form from the previous year. With the chief of selectors Scoo Beck ruled unavailable due to work and then holidays Neil effectively performed both jobs, which at times had him well and truly in the deep end but he rarely complained. Help was at hand mostly from Ant Sheeley and despite a costly regrade oversight Neil's job was executed with distinction. It is no surprise that Neil has been recognised by his peers in his award of co -clubman of the year.

In the treasurers role the fertile Adam Goss was replaced by Ross Ryan. Gossy is a great go to man for small projects and negotiations but his work and family commitments prevented him continuing in the executive role. My thanks go to Gossy for his ongoing support and work for the club. Ross likes cricket but has zero interest in roll his arm over or wielding the willow. He has previous experience in the treasurer's role at Corrimal and comes from an accounting background and was keen so we snapped him up.

Ross is the ideal treasurer as he insists on everything being done according the book. His professionalism has taken the clubs finances to the best organised they have ever been. A good deal of effort was put into the establishment and following of a very detailed budget. The framework put together this season will enable Ross and the committee to really focus on delivering a strong increase in sponsorship for the coming season. This will be essential to enable the club to deliver a number of objectives next season. The committee was rounded off with Adam Goss, Ean Martin, Matt Salakas (vice president), Callum Macdonald and Hugh Fullager.

The club was fortunate that at the same time as we were looing for a coach Barry Clapson was looking for a club. Barry has résumé as long as your arm of coaching clubs to success and had been cut lose by premiers Corrimal after helping them from their return to first grade to the top in three

seasons. Their loss was our gain. With Barry we started talking to number of senior players from throughout the competition who we believed might be able to help give the side a leg up in experience to help them with their on field performance and development. Despite some promising leads the club was unable to attract the signature of any of these guys which while it was disappointing at the time I believe will turn out to be a real blessing in disguise as this current crop continue to develop.

While we don't pay any players we do pay for Barry, which was a big brave step for the club, and I would again like to thank Bulli Workers club in helping us to provide resources like Barry for the players of the club. I make the point of emphasising the non-payment of players as I hope our club resists the move to semi professionalism for a long as possible.

Barry broke the game down for a lot of the guys young and old and helped the club to focus on building strong foundations in everything we do. Building partnerships and innings with the bat and building pressure with good bowling and fielding forcing the opposition to make mistakes and secure their wickets. These things showed in some excellent results for all sides at various stages throughout the year. With Barry signed up again for next season continued success will follow for all those who are willing to put the work in.

So with finances under control and the new club coach it was time for cricket!! Ill let the captain's reports detail how the sides went but I would like to make a couple of observations of my own.

Training was vastly improved over the last couple of seasons. With an external motivator on board and organised sessions most guys responded well and training numbers stayed relatively strong throughout the whole season. There is still room for improvement here but we are heading the right direction.

Club moral and spirit really returned to the club especially after Christmas. This was probably due to a couple of things. Firstly the work being put in at training was showing on the field and guys were really enjoying their cricket. Secondly the new guys in the club were settling in and they didn't have the baggage from our pent house to outhouse transition the seasons before. All the new guys this year helped to revitalise the club and lift the enthusiasm of those around them. Nowhere was this more evident than in the Mark Keefe led 4<sup>th</sup> grade team. Mark was not only the most organised captain we have had in years but also one of the fastest learning. After juggling the demands of his regulars and the many junior subs in the first half of the season revelled in the relatively stable line up after Chrissie and with the new blood of Dean Martin, Cam Carmody and guest appearances from Charlie Bradford and others the rest of the side started to fire. Guys like Clarry, Andy Metcalf and Mick Essentham all lifted and managed some great results for themselves and the club. We don't get to see much of the other grades when we are playing but I vividly remember looking across at one game where Adam Butcher was playing the reverse pull and big Mick and the French stick were slapping the opposition all over the place. They guys were having a ball and that helped them get home in a couple of tight ones which resulted in them winning 7 games in a row and just missing out on the semi's. Lastly but not insignificantly was the Barry Clapson inspired Thursday night debrief in the new sheds. Anthony Sheeley put in a magnificent effort to ensure the fridge was well stocked. This helped to bring the club together and encouraged the Sydney commuters to show up for training late even if it was just to grab a drink (Soo).

Anthony Sheeley had a strong presence off the field at training, with selections and with the organisation of eth beer fridge for Thursday nights after training. Ant focussed hard on his cricket

### **1<sup>ST</sup> GRADE**

Season 2006/07 saw great improvement for the Butchers 1<sup>st</sup> Grade side under new coach Barry Clapson (super coach). After the previous seasons disastrous result, the new season offered a chance to prove both to ourselves and to the other sides that there is plenty of ability and fight in the ranks of the Butchers.

While we only managed 3 wins throughout the season there were a number of near misses, including against Wests and Dapto in which after compiling 225 and 257 respectively, rain on the second day prevented likely victories. The side also showed fight against a number of the top sides, making them work extremely hard for a win.

The side showed tremendous improvement with the bat this year, scoring over 180 on eight occasions. This improvement was due in no small part to the efforts of Barry, who taught all the Batsmen to value their wicket. There were two players in particular who deserve particular mention. Mitchum Walters and Brett Murphy dragged the side out of trouble on more than a couple of occasions. Brett Murphy showed a mature attitude to his batting, as he amassed over 350 runs at an average of 44. While Mitch proved his class yet again with an outstanding season, compiling 441 runs at 40.

The Bowlers too showed great improvement with the aid of the super coach, showing greater discipline and application than has been evident in previous seasons. Lee Clouten was a stand out once again, leading the pace attack and taking 26 wickets at 19. While Steve Bond (keep that shirt on) offered great support, with 22 wickets at 15. One of the great improvers of the season was Tim McKenzie (also not afraid to take off his shirt) who led the spin attack in the second half of the season, and showed that spinners can open the bowling.

One of the most memorable moments of the season also involved Tim McKenzie. It was the last game of the season and Timmy was given an opportunity to open the Batting. He batted extremely well and managed to notch up a 50, at which time he started to wave his bat to the crowd. Firstly to the dressing room, then to his dad, then to anyone else he could find around the ground.

I would also like to thank a couple of guys who helped me out a great deal throughout the year. Firstly, Ean Martin who every home game took the covers off at 6:00am. He'd arrive at the game before anyone else and begin preparing drinks, putt out the boundary markers, set out the tables and chairs, and any other task he could find. Thanks Ean, your efforts are always appreciated.

Secondly, I have to thank Barry. This was my first year as captain and it would have been extremely difficult without Barry there to help guide me. Barry has a tremendous wealth of cricket knowledge, and his presence in the club has brought about great improvements. Hopefully next season Barry will be with us again, and the mighty Butchers will continue to improve. With the young talent we have in the club, it won't be long before we are challenging for the 1<sup>st</sup> Grade title.

### **2<sup>ND</sup> GRADE**

This season was one of success in terms of where we finished on the table and the overall improvement of our players mainly due to the fact that we have a good club coach in Barry Clapson. The greatest areas of improvement that I noticed were our batting mindset and our fielding/catching.

My first impressions of second grade (due to coming in at round 5) were mixed, We played Wollongong at Hollymount and were bowled out for 77, but with the strength of our bowling we were very happy to roll them for 74 (heart attack material).

Second grade this season played 14 games; two were won outright, six won first innings and one draw. On the losses we managed four 1<sup>st</sup> innings losses and an outright loss earlier in the season; this left us in fourth position (69 points) with everything to play for, full knowing what we were up against.

Keira was to be our obstacle in the first semi-final at Keira Oval.

On a very much rain affected weekend we won the toss and only got to bowl six over's before we came off and watched it rain all day. The second day was a 10.00 am start to make up time and it was here I saw our side put everything together in the field and with ball in hand that we spoke about for a number of weeks leading up to this game.

The main call of the day was to be patient, and we had to be when they were 1/90 after about 50 odd over's, then came Mick Allen and John Robinson to take up the attack and we watched as Keira went on to loose 9/40 and be bundled out for 130.

At this stage of the game you could not help but think about the following week and if we could do the impossible and win the competition. To be blunt we batted very poorly and did not apply ourselves with the bat and we were bundled out, for 85.

Keira went onto win the competition vs. Uni in a low scoring contest, so from a captains point of view we were beaten by the premiers which isn't all to bad.

There were a number of fine performances this season with the bat and the first was that comes to mind was Matt Chaplin who hammered the Corrimal attack all over the park scoring 87 runs from around 40 odd balls faced. In effect this delivered our first outright for the season. Scott Beckett was again on song come the backend of the season scoring a century vs. Helensburgh (113 not out).

In the bowling department we again had some good figures notable Graham Sismey who took 22 wickets from only 6 games. Rob Sheeley, John Robinson, Mick Allen, Matt Chaplin and Neil Ryan all bowled very well throughout the season, which placed us in a good position to win the games we did.

As mentioned previously our fielding was exceptional for the most part of the season, Mitch White and Chris Mortimer shared the most part of the season behind the stumps doing a good job. The semi-final saw Brett Cleaves behind the stumps for the backend of the Keira Innings in which he tore his calf taking a catch down leg side.

I would like to thank the butcher's management for this season, and the selectors as well. A great club like the butchers does not run without great people putting four sides on the field every round and managing the day to day operations.

On an overall note NDCC 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade side had a very good year, made even better by the side participating in the semi-finals which has not happened for a while. Again our batting was our downfall when it counted, but our bowling whatever way you look at it was arguably the best in the second grade competition. We all had a laugh and a good time and at the end of the day "that's why we all play cricket".

Have a good off season boys and thanks for being a great bunch of guys.
