PRESIDENTS REPORT

The 2010-11 season was one of transition for Illawarra Cricket. The Association was faced with many issues not the least being the financial situation which had deteriorated over recent seasons. I am pleased to report that this has been rectified to some extent but warn that vigilance will be required for the next few seasons to ensure that the Association returns to a sound financial position. The turnaround can be attributed to the support of Cricket NSW who were generous enough to provide a grant of \$10,000 to offset some of the losses incurred in holding the Ford Ranger Cup match in 2009-10. Another source of financial support came via a new major sponsor in The IMB Building Society who contributed \$7,000. We look forward to a long and successful relationship with them and I urge all clubs and their members to support IMB wherever possible. A glance at the financials will reveal that the clubs contributed a substantial sum to the Association by way of fines. This was unexpected at the start of the season but was disappointing from an administrative point of view. The fact that fines became necessary means that the Association administrator has needed to carry out unnecessary extra work.

During the season three members of the Management Committee resigned. All resignations were due to work commitments. I would like to thank Gordon Treadwell, Ean Martin and Paul Brockley for their contribution to Illawarra cricket over a number of years. Paul of course is not lost to us as he has been appointed to the position of Illawarra/Southern Regional Cricket Manager. I look forward to working closely with him in the future.

This season I urge the clubs to nominate people for the Management Committee. I often hear that a certain club or clubs is not represented on the Management Committee but this is generally because no one nominates. This Association is an Association of clubs and it is up to the clubs to play their part in the running of the Association.

I don't wish to go into great detail about our achievements in representative cricket as the coaches and managers of the various teams have provided in depth reports elsewhere in this document. However, I wish to mention a few highlights. The Under-17s under the guidance of Grant Rodwell won the Southern Under-17's Carnival and the Under-15s coached by Paul Brockley were runners up in the Weblin Shield. The highlight as far as the seniors was concerned was the win over a full strength Newcastle in the Tennant—Ewin Shield. This win gives us the optimism to expect good performances in the Country Championships in the years to come.

The Association again fulfilled all its commitments to the NSW Country programmes and overall I believe put in creditable performances. I would like to make special mention of Dapto who made the last 8 of the SCG Country Cup. Unfortunately the 20/20 competition was ruined by rain and I expect the Committee will schedule it later in the season in future. I would like to congratulate the various grade premiers and in particular Northern Districts who won the first club championship in the clubs history. I would like to make special mention of Glyn Stanham who has done an excellent job as our Administrator. This view is generously supported by Bruce Whitehouse the NSW Country Cricket Co-Ordinator. Glyn again ran a very successful Bradman Cup and was complimented by all zones that competed.

The Management Committee did a great job when you consider we were three men short for a good part of the season. I thank Joanne Lehane for joining the Committee in January and I am sure she has much to offer. Mark Johnston, Brett Buckley, Charlie Brockley, Julie Munn and Morgan Prosser all made valuable contributions to the running of cricket in Illawarra.

I would like to make mention of the Junior Sub-Committee who did a wonderful job. Di Piggott and her fellow committee members should be congratulated on the running of the various junior competitions and representative programme. Like the seniors they too could do with more help. I am sure they will continue run as efficiently for many seasons to come.

Finally, I would like to thank my wife, Kerrie, for her support as I have been away from home much more often than expected.

Our campaign began with a convincing win over the Newcastle side in the Barry Mayne / Ken Crossley Shield game that was played at Newcastle. With a solid effort from all the bowlers and an intensive fielding performance from the CI boys we kept them to a score of only 114 after 45 overs. Our run chase began with a slow start from our top order but gained momentum with our middle order of Brody O'Brien, Kain Flynn Duncombe and Sameer Murthy pushing the runs along quickly to reach Newcastle's total in the 38th over.

The next trial match saw us playing a rematch of the Lismore Carnival Final against Central Coast the previous season where we were narrowly defeated by only 5 runs so it only seemed fitting to throw out the challenge to them and see how we would perform this time round. Central Coast batted first setting a total of 188 for the boys to chase but unfortunately we were unable to reach their total and fell short in the 50th over by 21 runs.

Our NSW DCA campaign started with the first round against Sutherland being washed out and the draw dealt us a bye in round 2 so we had to wait until the round 3 before we bowled a ball in anger. I believe two players would've been sufficient. This, comes back to the selection process and who was involved selecting the squad. I believe that the CI HPU Co-ord. should've, with independent selectors and input from the K.C coach, selected the squad. This squad was selected primarily by me and the U13 coach. A lot of the selection meetings were spent with the U13 coach pushing all of his players. There was also an issue at K.C, but that comes down to me and my inexperience. I will, however learn from the whole experience and hopefully handle the situation better in the future.

Also, as I said there are some talented players in this squad. They step up at club level and score runs but when it comes to Rep, they go missing. Very frustrating to see your best batsman score a century the Saturday after you come back from K.C where he got to 20ish everyday then got out. The other issue I saw as a Rep coach is, for example, I pick a player as a wicket keeper, but he doesn't keep at club level because they need to hide a player and they decide to hide him keeping. I had 3 or 4 instances of this in my team (an opening bowler for me kept on weekends at club). These guys need to get that game experience and at the moment they aren't and I believe this is impacting on their performance for CI.

Although not taking wickets Riverina's chase was restricted by great line and length bowling with excellent support in the field. Riverina were 5-75 after 32 overs and requiring 7 runs per over for victory then lost wickets regularly. Illawarra's performance was a committed team effort.

Conclusion

Based on the final overall competition results, the result and performance of day 2 against Central Coast destined Illawarra to finishing second in Pool 2 with 2 wins and 1 loss behind Central Coast with 3 wins. What could have been if Illawarra progressed to the final? (Central Coast dismissed for just 51)

Overall, the team should be congratulated on their approach and enthusiasm. The team performed creditably with all players contributing at some stage throughout the carnival. Once the team focused on the game plans and played as a team unit, Illawarra, I believe could realistically match it will any other country zone in this competition. It should be noted that the team also contained 6 players from the under 15-age group who gained valuable experience at this level and will be eligible again next year.

Many thanks go to Maryanne Head as team scorer who did a fantastic job. Special mention and thanks for the support shown by many of the team parents who assisted with the required off field tasks such covers, ground preparations, scoreboard duties, drinks & lunch allocations at times in difficult circumstances. Their assistance was greatly appreciated.

ANNUAL REPORT – 2010/2011

ILLAWARRA

The 2010/2011 cricket season in Illawarra began on 11th September with the now traditional pre-season training seminar conducted by Laurie Borg, Graham Chudleigh, Alan Mantle and Stephen Poole. Informative sessions were presented on the 2010 changes to the Laws, the LBW law, dealing with conflict, hydration and aspects of sports psychology. The presentation of the sessions was excellent and the seminar was well received by all participants. A similar pre-season seminar is planned for 27th August 2011.

On 23rd October, the University of Wollongong conducted its second Celebrity Twenty20 match at University Oval to raise funds for medical research. The match was hosted by Adam Gilchrist and featured former Australian Test representatives Andy Bichel, Greg Campbell, Wayne Holdsworth and Glen McGrath, ex-English players Adam Hollioake and Robin Smith, current New Zealand player Scott Styris and Australian women's team members Alyssa Healy and Elise Perry. Despite threatening weather, an enthusiastic crowd was treated to an entertaining match, highlights of which were later screened by WIN TV. Neil Findlay and Bill Massingham spent a most enjoyable afternoon umpiring the fixture.

The Preliminary Rounds of the SCG Country Cup began at the end of October and, with all matches being played between Illawarra and Southern Zone teams, one umpire from Illawarra and one umpire from the Southern Zone were appointed to each match. Once again all those involved appreciated the opportunity to officiate with new colleagues and to umpire teams from the neighbouring Zone. The Illawarra umpires appointed were Laurie Borg, David Cullen, Brian Druery, Neil Findlay, Jeff Gittings, Darren Goodger, Greg Heys, Mark Simula and Denis Veronese. Dapto and University of Wollongong then progressed to the SCG Country Cup Final 8 Series where both teams were eliminated.

Unfortunately the popular mid-week twilight Twenty20 Competition, scheduled during October-December, had to be abandoned because of persistent inclement weather. Only the first round of the competition could be completed. However, the annual Twenty20 match between the Illawarra senior representative team and Bankstown Cricket Club was able to be played under lights at North Dalton Park on 18th November. The umpires for this contest were David Dobinson and Bill Massingham.

During 11th – 14th January, the Bradman Cup under 16 Competition was again conducted in Wollongong. The umpires for the Pool matches were Charles Brockley, Dave Cullen, David Dobinson, Brian Druery, Jeff Gittings, Evan Lane, Barry Moir, John Saye, Ray Trindall and Denis Veronese. Neil Findlay and Lachlan Walker (Southern Zone) were appointed to umpire the Final at North Dalton Park in which Newcastle convincingly defeated Central Coast. It was pleasing that, at the conclusion of the competition, the umpires were commended for their efforts by both team officials and supporting parents alike.

The Phil Jaques under 21 One Day competition was conducted on Sundays during December and January. The umpires for this competition were Laurie Borg, Dave Cullen, Neil Findlay, Jeff Gittings, Darren Goodger, Evan Lane, Ean Martin, Bill Massingham, Barry Moir, Muhammad Qureshi, John Saye, Steve Saye, Ray Trindall and Denis Veronese. The Final played at North Dalton Park and umpired by Jeff Gittings and John Saye was fittingly won by Wests-Illawarra, the club for which Phil Jaques played his early cricket.

The One Day Finals were conducted in February and the officiating umpires were:

- 1st Grade: Keira v. Northern Districts – Greg Heys and John Saye
- 2nd Grade: Northern Districts v. Dapto – David Cullen and Steve Saye
- 3rd Grade: University of Wollongong v. Wests-Illawarra – Charles Brockley and Jeff Gittings

Several fixtures in the 1st Grade One Day Competition were played as a day-night matches at North Dalton Park. Each match was well supported by spectators from each club involved and the initiative has sparked enough interest for it to continue next season.

Just prior to the conclusion of the senior competition the local junior Finals were conducted. Barry Moir was appointed to umpire the Wests-Illawarra Red v. Keira under 14A match while Charles Brockley and Wal Smith stood in the Wests-Illawarra v. Warilla Sports under 16A Final.

The season finally culminated at the end of March with Two Day Finals in 1st, 2nd and 3rd Grade and a One Day Final in 4th Grade. The appointed umpires were:

- 1st Grade: Dapto v. University of Wollongong – Neil Findlay and Greg Heys
- 2nd Grade: Northern Districts v. Wests-Illawarra – Steve Saye and Mark Simula
- 3rd Grade: Dapto v. Northern Districts – David Cullen and Denis Veronese
- 4th Grade: Dapto Gold v. Northern Districts Sky – Brian Druery and John Saye

At NSW Country level, Mark Simula and Denis Veronese were members of the Country Umpires Supplementary Panel while Neil Findlay and Bill Massingham were appointed to the Country Umpires Representative Panel. Unfortunately, before the season began Bill was forced to withdraw from his Country appointments owing to illness. Both Mark and Denis umpired several matches at Bowral's picturesque Bradman Oval. Denis officiated in the Country under 17 Trial (November) and the NSW under 17 v. Bradman Foundation XI (December) while Mark was appointed to the City under 17 v. Country under 17 match (November) and the Kookaburra Cup Final (January). In December, they stood together in the SCG Plate Semi-Finals in Orange and finally in February they were privileged to umpire at the SCG – Denis in the Under 14 Twenty20 Challenge and Mark in the Under 16 State Twenty20 Challenge. It was a unique occasion to have two Illawarra umpires officiating on the SCG on the same day! Neil travelled to Tamworth for the Country Championships in November; travelled

to Dubbo for the Country Colts Championships in January and finally officiated in the annual two-day Country Colts v. City Colts fixture at Blacktown in March. Along with several other members of the Country Panels, Mark and Neil also accepted an invitation to umpire in the Sydney Grade Competition in February.

For the first time, an Illawarra Zone Development Panel Zone was formed as a pathway for those aspiring to umpire at Country level. The members of this Zone Panel were David Cullen, David Dobinson and Grey Heys and to promote their development they were appointed to the SCG Country Cup, the Konica Cup and the Bradman Cup competitions and Illawarra senior representative matches.

A significant number of umpires were afforded opportunities to officiate in representative matches. In November, Illawarra played in the Konica Cup Twenty20 competition against teams from the A.C.T. and Newcastle. Umpires for the home matches played at North Dalton Park were Neil Findlay, Greg Heys, Mark Simula and Denis Veronese. In March, the annual Tennant-Ewin Challenge between Illawarra and Newcastle was played at North Dalton Park. The umpires for this contest, in which an inexperienced Illawarra team convincingly defeated their more fancied opponents, were David Dobinson and Neil Findlay. Charles Brockley, Evan Lane, Barry Moir, John Saye and Ray Trindall were also the umpires appointed to various Illawarra teams in the NSW junior DCA Inter-Association Shield Competitions. Finally, Allan Bell, Neil Findlay, Evan Lane and John Saye officiated in the NSW 15 Years Schoolboys Trials conducted in December and February.

As in previous seasons, there were losses and gains in the overall membership of the Association. Work commitments unfortunately prevented Daniel Benstead from continuing his umpiring while illness limited Bill Massingham's involvement and Pat Johnston was forced to reluctantly retire because of medical reasons. On the other hand, the Association was strengthened by the addition of Greg Heys, a well-credentialed former Sydney Grade umpire, who moved into the district during the off-season and was clearly one of the best performed umpires during the season. Once again the experienced Laurie Borg and Darren Goodger were members of the Association and officiated when free of Sydney umpiring commitments while Muhammad Qureshi, an aspiring Sydney Grade umpire, also joined the Association and officiated whenever available. Further, after an enforced break of two years Wal Smith made a welcome return for the One-Day Semi-Finals and his comment at the time: "It's great to be back!" was echoed by everyone. Finally, it is pleasing to report that John Saye and Ray Trindall passed the NSWCUSA examination in December and have now been accepted as members of the State Association. Darren Goodger is to be thanked for preparing them so thoroughly for the examination.

The outstanding efforts throughout the season of the office bearers of the Illawarra Cricket Umpires Association should also be acknowledged. President, Morgan Prosser, has continued to lead the Association enthusiastically and has been ably assisted by Secretary-Treasurer Charles Brockley. Unfortunately, Charles has recently found it necessary to resign from his position and he has been replaced by Barry Moir. Charles has made a significant contribution to the Association, notably in his negotiation of the long term sponsorship of the Association by the AMCAL Dapto Mall Pharmacy, and he is to be congratulated and thanked for this and his other achievements. In addition, our gratitude is extended to the NSW Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association for their continuing support. The on-going involvement of Laurie Borg and Darren Goodger in the Illawarra Cricket Umpires' Association is greatly appreciated and it was pleasing to have had Graham Chudleigh represent the NSW Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association at this season's Annual General Meeting. The Illawarra Cricket Umpires' Association looks forward to continuing this close relationship with the NSW Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association long into the future.

DELEGATE TO NSWCCA COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT REPORT

I believe that the New South Wales Country Cricket Association had another successful year. It seems that as each season comes and goes the workload of the Association increases. We again ran all our competitions successfully. The programme is becoming extremely congested and with the advent of the under 19 carnival this coming season the number of dates for carnivals is decreasing. We believe that the under 19 initiative will be of benefit to Country Cricket as it will fill the void between the under 17s and the Country Colts carnival.

The Committee of Management has also made significant changes to the Womens programme in an effort to increase the participation of women and girls in genuine country competitions within the zones. Some will disagree with the splitting of the Country Championship into two carnivals. This was a very difficult decision for the Committee to make but over the past few seasons it has become obvious that we have been able to get all the best players to the Championship. The main reasons for this have been time off work and the distance to the carnival venue. We hope this change will ensure that the best players compete.

The Association is again appreciative of the financial support, which exceeds \$1,000,000, provided by the New South Wales Cricket Board. Without this support it would be impossible to operate at our present level. An example of one area that money is used to support is coaching. In the last season over \$140,000 was used to support the Regional Directors of Coaching in Country Cricket. The Board also supported numerous grants to clubs, associations, councils and zones—this season a total of \$154,600.

The Association is also fortunate to have a number of other generous sponsors. The Sydney Cricket and Sports Ground Trust provides \$160,000 towards the SCG Country Cup. This is the largest rural and regional cricket competition anywhere in the world. The Big Brother Movement and Kookaburra are also generous with their support.

Country Cricket continues to produce players that move on to play at the highest level. Again six country players were selected for the NSW under 17s and a number of country players including Trent Copeland, Nick Maddinson and Mark Hogan played first class cricket.

Unfortunately the New South Wales Country team finished third at the CBACC in Bunbury. I was in Bunbury to see our team perform and I can assure everyone that their effort could not be faulted. As I have stated before the points system needs to be revised as it seems to work against us season after season. To captain Jeff Cook, Coach Mark Curry and Manager Glenn Rowlands I can only congratulate you on your efforts.

Illawarra should cherish its position as an independent zone. The finances for the various coaching programmes and carnivals that we participate in are provided via Cricket NSW and Country Cricket NSW. The positions of Regional Cricket Manager and Zone administrator are also supported by Cricket NSW.

Illawarra again ran a very successful Bradman Cup. The Zone and especially Glyn Stanham received the praise of all involved including the Country Cricket Association and participating zones, players and officials.

All country cricketers need to acknowledge the enormous amount of work done by John Sullivan and Bruce Whitehouse. They travel an increasing number of kilometers each year to ensure that all the carnivals are run successfully. As I have mentioned previously as each season passes their just seems to be getting bigger and I have greatly enjoyed working with them.

I have again been privileged to represent Illawarra on the Committee of Management. I can assure all that I do not take this honour for granted.
